### Edith Baker Art Scholarship

To celebrate its twentieth anniversary in 2005, the Association created the Edith Baker Art Scholarship, which annually benefits a graduating senior from Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts. Along with a financial award of \$3,000, the student's work is highlighted in an exhibition at a member gallery with the rest of the class's work in May.
